ORDER OF NO PROBABLE CAUSE

THIS CAUSE came on to be heard by the Florida Elections Commission at its regularly scheduled meeting held on November 14, 2007, in Tallahassee, Florida.

Based on the complaint, Report of Investigation, Staff Recommendations submitted by the staff, written statements submitted by the Respondent, and any oral statements made at the probable cause hearing, the Commission finds that there is **no probable cause** to charge the Respondent with the following violations:

Section 104.011(1), Florida Statutes, prohibiting a person from falsely swearing or affirming an oath or procuring another to falsely swear or affirm an oath in connection with or arising out of voting or elections;

Section 104.011(2), Florida Statutes, prohibiting a person from submitting false voter registration information; and

Section 104.041, Florida Statutes, prohibiting a person from perpetrating, attempting to perpetrate, or aiding in the perpetration of any fraud in connection with any vote cast, to be cast, or attempting to be cast.

Therefore, it is **ORDERED** that this case is **DISMISSED**.
