AFFIDAVIT OF DETECTIVE [REDACTED]

Before Leslie Schneida, Judge of the Circuit Court of Boone County, Missouri, the undersigned, being duly sworn, deposes and says:

That he has reason to believe that certain evidence and controlled substance, to wit: MARIJUANA, A SCHEDULE I CONTROLLED SUBSTANCE and the evidence of the crime of drug trafficking to include records, phone numbers, cash, and apparatuses to facilitate the use and distribution of controlled substances,

Are presently concealed at/within and will be concealed at/within 1501 Kinloch Court, Columbia/Boone County, Missouri. 1501 Kinloch Court is the fourth residence west of Glencairn Drive, on the north side of Kinloch Court. The front door for the residence faces south and the numbers "1501" are clearly marked on the residence. This search warrant should include the entire premises thereof, all persons present on the premises, and any vehicles associated to anyone located on the premises.

And in support of his belief states the following:

I am a Narcotics Detective for the Columbia Missouri Police Department and have been employed with the Columbia Missouri Police Department for over 15 years. I have received over two hundred hours of training specifically in the area of controlled substances. I have written over 75 search warrants and have participated in the execution of over 100 search warrants. In addition, I have been involved in numerous narcotics related investigations resulting in the arrest and prosecution of numerous individuals.

On 3-11-09 I received information from a cooperating citizen with a history of truthfulness and reliability. This cooperating citizen has provided information that has resulted in seizures of marijuana and large amounts of currency. This cooperating citizen advised Jonathan Whitworth is selling large amounts of high grade marijuana in the Columbia area.

Within the past 10 days, I was contacted by another cooperating citizen who has proven reliable and truthful on numerous occasions. This cooperating citizen has also provided information that has led to seizures of controlled substances and currency. This cooperating citizen advised Jonathan Whitworth lives at 1501 Kinloch Court and is selling marijuana. Whitworth had a large amount of high grade marijuana inside his residence. This cooperating citizen has observed a large amount of high grade marijuana inside Whitworth's residence within the past 10 days.

Based on the information provided by the cooperating citizens, I conducted a trash pull at 1501 Kinloch Court, the residence of Jonathan Whitworth on 1-27-10. This was the regularly scheduled trash collection date for this area of town and there were several bags of trash set curbside in front of this residence awaiting collection. During an examination of the contents of these trash bags, I found mail to the Whitworth Family, 1501 Kinloch Court, a baggy containing residue and numerous items of drug paraphernalia with residue on them. I field tested a sample of this residue and it field tested positive for the presence of THC.

Johnathan Whitworth is the utilities subscriber for 1501 Kinloch Court. According to Columbia Police Department records, Jonathan Whitworth lists 1501 Kinloch Court as his residence.

Jonathan Whitworth has a Missouri SID # of MO01238758 and an FBI # of 188895DC4. Whitworth has numerous previous arrests including resisting arrest, possession of marijuana, delivery, manufacturing controlled substance prior/persistent offender and DWI. The Columbia Police Department has received information dating back to 2003 indicating Whitworth's involvement in the sales and distribution of controlled substances.

Based on the information provided by two reliable cooperating citizens, the observations of marijuana inside the residence within the past 10 days by a reliable cooperating citizen, and a trash pull conducted on Whitworth's residence where residue containing THC was recovered, it is my belief there is currently marijuana and evidence of drug trafficking inside 1501 Kinloch Court at this time.

Due to previous training and experiences I know it is common for drug dealers to have on their person, and on the premises, controlled substances, records and other evidence of crimes of the sales and/or possession of controlled substances. I also know that drug dealers often transport and store controlled substances in motor vehicles.
